Purim

English

In English this week, the children created posters advertising day trips to the moon, to help out Bob (A Day in the Life by Simon Bartram). They thought about the features of a poster that might attract visitors and tried to use persuasive language.

Maths

This week in Maths, the children moved on from doubling and halving numbers to halving shapes and learning how to write this as a fraction $-\frac{1}{2}$. Children were able to fold and cut shapes into two equal pieces, understanding that this means half.

Topic

The class discussed the names of different body parts and why we need them. They then moved on to the eyes, ears, nose, tongue and skin and related these to the senses. They were able to identify the taste buds on each other's tongues and how these help us to taste and that we use our noses to smell. They knew that the eyes are for seeing, the ears and for hearing and that we use our whole bodies to touch.

Jewish Studies

We finished our graggers, made Hamantaschen and raced around the playground to our find the answers to our Purim quiz and of course we had the best time on Thursday in our Purim costumes making mishloach manot and hearing the Megillah.

<u>Ivrit</u>

This week Year 1 carried on learning to say words for Purim such as: לֵיצָנִית (Leitzan – clown, masculine), לֵיצָנִית (Leitzanit – clown, feminine) מֵלֶךּ (Melech – king), מַלְכָּה (Masechot – masks) and שָׁמֵחַ פּוּרִים (Masechot – masks) and מֵסֵכוֹת (Purim sameach – happy Purim) and use them in sentences.

The class learnt the song נֵחְמֶד וְקְטָ לֵיִצְן (Leitzan katan nechmad – nice little clown) which you can find on https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=D4utHy2NMK0

Next Week

In English the children will be describing aliens from the story 'A Day in the Life' and asking the characters questions. In Maths, the class will be continuing with fractions, learning about halves and quarters.

In Topic, Year 1 will be comparing different materials.
