English

In English this week, the children reread the story 'A Day in the Life' by Simon Bartram and spotted the aliens hidden in each illustration. They then wrote a description of themselves as one of the aliens. The children wrote questions that they might want to ask the various characters in the story and thought about the replies they might receive.

Maths

This week in Maths, the children continued to learn about halves of shapes before moving on to finding quarters of shapes

and writing this as a fraction $-\frac{1}{4}$. They were then able to find halves and quarters of amounts. The children then began learning how to tell the time, using their knowledge of halves and quarters to help them.

Science

The class investigated various materials this week, finding items around the room made from glass, metal, plastic and wood and explaining how they knew this. They used magnifying glasses to take a closer look at each material, noticing the grains of wood and the threads of fabric. The children linked this to the topic by discussing why a builder's hat should be hard and a police man's jacket should be soft.

Jewish Studies

We have made an excellent start on our Haggadahs. We are asking lots of questions and really trying to understand all the different symbolism to the Pesach seder. We can't wait for you to see all our independent hard work. Of course we have been singing too.

<u>Ivrit</u>

This week Year 1 started to learn to say שָׁמֵחַ פֵּסַח (Pesach sameach – happy Pesach) שָׁמֵחַ חַג (Chag sameach – happy festival) אַלַחַת (Tzalachat – plate), בַּיִצָּה (Beitza – egg), אֵגוֹז (Egoz – nut). The class began learning the song בָּאֶגוֹזִים (Be'egozim nesacheka – we will play with nuts) which you can find on www.youtube.com/watch?v=pelcC amjm4
