Dear Parents,

The children have had an exciting and busy week in preparation for Pesach and concluding the term.

# **English**

In English this week the class have been focusing on adverts. The children have been identifying the key features of an advert and have written an advert for a new raft for the main characters in our story: The Boy and a Bear in a Boat. The children have also been learning why we use hyphens, how to apply them to our writing and how they clarify meaning.

## Maths

In Maths this week the children have been focusing on rounding decimals to whole numbers, two decimal places and one decimal place. This activity helped the children identify the place value within decimals. They applied their understanding of place value in decimals to ordering decimals and other problem solving scenarios.

### Other Areas of the Curriculum

This week the children have been exploring the school for magnetic objects. The children have been exploring the properties of different materials and if being magnetic are crucial to their purpose. The children have continued their work on reversible and irreversible changes and explained the journey the particles take when transitioning between them.

### **Jewish Studies**

In Jewish Studies this week the children practiced their songs for the seder and continued to work on their haggadot. They also practiced their various parts for the seder in order to be ready to lead with confidence. Everyone is looking forward to Pesach and working hard to be ready to celebrate it meaningfully.

#### Ivrit:

Year 5 carried on with the topic בְּגָדִים (Bgadim – clothes). The focus of this week was on clothes in singular such as: Year 5 has started a new topic on בְּגָדִים (Bgadim – clothes). The vocabulary of this topic is: חוּלְצָה (Chultza – top), מְעִיל (Chatzayit – skirt), בְּגָדִים (Kova – hat), שִׁמְלָה (Simla – dress), מְעִיל (Meil – coat), מְעִיל (Sveder – jumper), מְנְדָלִים (Michnasayim – trousers), מַגְפַיִים (Magafayim – boots), מַרְּדָלִים (Sandalim – sandals), מְנְדָלִים (Meilim – coats), מְלוֹתשׁ (Smalot – dresses), מְלוֹתשׁ (Hatzaiot – skirts), מְעִילִים (Kovaim – hats), מְלוֹתשׁ (Chultzot – tops), בֹוֹבָעִים (Lovesh – wearing, masculine), מְלוֹבְשׁ (Loveshet – wearing, feminine), and we combined clothes with colours: עָׁרוֹל (Kachol – blue), חוּל (Chum – brown), בַּתוֹם (Shachor – black), שָׁרוֹם (Adom – red), יָרוֹק (Yarok – green), יִרוֹם (Carod – pink), יַרוֹם (Lavan – white), בַּרוֹב (Tzahov – yellow) and תָּכֶלֶת (Tchelet – turquoise).
