Dear Parents,

The children have had a very busy week!

English

In English this week we continued our work on the novel Street Child. The children created drama performances to help understand Jim's next actions after having been evicted from his home. The children have also been looking at the key features of letter writing in order to help with the extended write next week they were able to identify what needs to be included in a letter to ensure it makes sense and is delivered.

Maths

This week, the children have been introduced to the idea of polygons. They have been identifying regular and irregular polygons and had to sort out a range of different shapes into these two categories. The children have also been identifying a range of different quadrilaterals and they have identified the properties of different rectangles to help find the lengths and angles.

Other Areas of the Curriculum

In Science this week the children continue to their work with micro-organisms. Using a special gel and UV lights the children were able to see the germs on their hands after touching a range of different objects. The children enjoyed the whole school music concert and performed their song, Two Queens, beautifully. Year Five had lots of fun at Sports Day and participated in competitive and team games. In History the children were comparing a Victorian school to schools of the 21st-century. The children looked at a range of different areas, such as discipline, classroom, equipment and many more.

Jewish Studies

In Jewish Studies the children were given various Etgar topics to design games about, which they then made in pairs and once these were done, children played each other's games in order to revise their Jewish general knowledge. Children also worked on their Hebrew reading.

Ivrit:

Year 5 carried on their end of topic assessment task about clothes - בְּגָּדִים (Bgadim). They are assessed on all the words they learnt throughout this topic and how they are creating sentences with them. The words that the assessment is about are: מִּלְבָּיִה (Chultza – top), חַּנְצָאִית (Chatzayit – skirt), מְּנִיבָּ (Kova – hat), מְּנִיבָּי (Simla – dress), מְנִיבָּי (Michnasayim – trousers), מְנִיבָּי (Magafayim – boots), מְנִיִּלִים (Sandalim – sandals), מְנִילִים (Meilim – coats), שְׁמָלוֹת (Smalot – dresses), מְנִילִים (Hatzaiot – skirts), מִנְיִלִים (Kovaim – hats), חַּנְצִאִיוֹת (Chultzot – tops), לוֹבָשֶׁת (Lovesh – wearing, masculine), לוֹבָשֶׁת (Chum – brown) בָּתוֹל (Kachol – blue), מִנִילִים (Chum – brown) בְּתוֹם (Katom – orange) אָפוֹר (Sagol – purple), יְרוֹק (Varod – pink), יָרוֹק (Lavan – white), בְּתוֹל (Tzahov – yellow) and (Tchelet – turquoise).
