Dear Parents,

The children have had a very busy week!

English:

In English this week the children used their home learning plan to complete their letter writing. The children used their plan and other resources to help support their writing. The children have also continued their work with our class novel 'Street Child', and have responded to the text through Art and Drama.

Maths:

In Maths this week the children continued their work on the properties of rectangles. The children also began understanding 2D and 3D shapes and creating nets to represent their shapes. The children created skyscrapers of these shapes and we created a Year 5 village of all of them assembled together.

Other Areas of the Curriculum:

This week the children participated in Victorian day where they were introduced to a range of activities that a Victorian child would experience. This included: slate and dip pen writing, Victorian games, Union Jack flag making and drawing nature. The children also experienced a Victorian playtime where they were able to entertain themselves in the same manner as a Victorian child. The children also created paper spinners which were very popular during the Victorian era. Year 5 concluded their link with the Year 5 children from St Paul's Church of England School. The children joined St Paul's in Mill Hill Park where they played a range of team building games followed by a picnic lunch. The children were given the opportunity to play a range of playground games and sporting activities and build great bonds with the other pupils. It was a lovely afternoon in the park. In Science this week the children have been looking at the different ways animals reproduce. They also focused on the quantity they can produce at one time.

Jewish Studies:

In Jewish Studies this week we continued working on our Etgar general knowledge, focusing on mitzvot and the way we classify them. We then looked at six mitzvot in more detail and the children made leaflets to explain these mitzvot in their own words. We also worked on our Hebrew reading. The parasha this week is Shelach and we focus on how the spies who were sent to the land showed a lack of respect by reporting to the people as a whole rather than to their leader Moshe who had sent them. We discussed the importance of showing respect and behaving in a respectful way.

<u>lvrit:</u>

Year 5 carried on their end of topic assessment task about clothes - בָּגָדִים (Bgadim). They are assessed on all the words they learnt throughout this topic and how they are creating sentences with them. The words that the assessment is about are: אָרָשָׁח, (Chultza – top), חֲצָאִית (Chatzayit – skirt), עָבוֹבַעָע (Kova – hat), מְעִיל (Simla – dress), מְעָיל (Meil – coat), חוּלְצָה (Sveder – jumper), מְכָנָסַיִים (Michnasayim – trousers), מַגְפַיִים (Magafayim – boots), חַנָּקַיִים (Sandalim – sandals), מָעָילִים (Meilim – coats), שָׁמָלוֹת (Smalot – dresses), (Hatzaiot – skirts), סַנְדָלִים (Kovaim – hats), חוּלְצוֹת (Chultzot – tops), שָׁמָלוֹת (Lovesh – wearing, masculine), שָׁמוֹל (Loveshet – wearing, feminine), and we combined clothes with colours: סָנוֹבָעִים (Kachol – blue), בָּחוֹל (Chum – brown), בָּתוֹם (Katom – orange), אָפוֹר (Afor – grey), חוּל (Yarok – green), אָדוֹם (Sagol – purple), דוֹז (Varod – pink), וָכוֹע (Lavan – white), אָדוֹם, (Tzahov – yellow) and אָכָלָמים (Tchelet – turquoise).
