Dear Parents,

This week we have we have been very busy and have gone off timetable.

English

In English this week the children have continued their work with our class book 'Street Child'. The children have read about Jim's journey from the workhouse and have made predictions about what will happen next. The children have also inferred from character descriptions about the appearance of new characters and have drawn these.

Maths

In Maths this week the children have concluded the curriculum. The children have learnt how to convert between metric and imperial measurements, and have answered this in problem solving contexts.

Jewish Studies

In Jewish Studies we have started learning the Amidah by looking at its name and structure. The children have also had a chance to learn some of its 'choreography' and we are looking forward to learning more of it next year so that we can incorporate it more regularly in our tefillah.

Rabbi Bazak Question and Answer Sessions

This week the children concluded their work with Rabbi Bazak. Throughout the year, Rabbi Bazak has been coming into the classroom to answer any questions the children have about Judaism. The sessions have been excellent at enhancing the children's curiosity and have helped to shape them into independent Jewish thinkers.

Victorian Homes

This week the children have been designing and creating Victorian homes. We began our work with identifying the differences between our homes and Victorian homes and rich and poor houses. In groups the children designed a Victorian house, and using saws and glue guns the children were able to build the houses themselves.

Ivrit

Year 5 carried on their end of topic assessment task about clothes - בְּגִדִים (Bgadim). They are assessed on all the words they learnt throughout this topic and how they are creating sentences with them. The words that the assessment is about are: מְצִילוֹ (Chultza – top), חֲצָאיֹת (Chatzayit – skirt), טְּוֹבֶּע (Kova – hat), חַוּלְצָה (Simla – dress), מְנָדָלִים (Simla – dress), מְנָדָלִים (Sveder – jumper), יְסִיְּוֹבֶל (Michnasayim – trousers), מַגָּפַיִים (Magafayim – boots), סְוֹדֶל (Sandalim – sandals), מְנָיִלִים (Meilim – coats), שְׂמָלוֹת (Smalot – dresses)) מְנָיִלִים (Hatzaiot – skirts), מְנָיִלִים (Kovaim – hats), חוּלְצָתִים (Chultzot – tops), לוֹבֵשׁ (Lovesh – wearing, masculine), לוֹבָשׁ (Loveshet – wearing, feminine), and we combined clothes with colours: יָרוֹ (Kachol – blue), חוּם (Chum – brown), פָׁתוֹם (Shachor – black), אָפוֹר (Adom – red), יָרוֹק (Yarok – green), יָרוֹק (Tzahov – yellow) and תָּכֶלֶת (Tchelet – turquoise).
