Dear Parents,

The children have had a great first week getting to know the new classroom, systems and adults around the classroom. They were exceptionally welcoming to the new children in the class. The children thought about important checklists for behaviour, writing and maths work which were added to 'anchor charts' and hung around the classroom as a constant reminder.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, the children have started to look at the place value of three and four digit numbers. They represented numbers using concrete resources and unpicked the hundreds, tens and ones within the numbers. They used place value grids to show the value of each digit in the numbers. The children were also introduced to a song about the 3 times table which has helped some of them to cement their knowledge.

<u>English</u>

The children began to explore their new book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. They listened to the first chapter read to them and thought about and wrote what type of person Charlie might be like. They were also introduced to the chocolate factory. They retrieved information from the text about what the chocolate factory looked like and, pretending to be Charlie, wrote about how they felt standing outside and looking at the factory.

Other areas of the curriculum

The children took part in various 'getting to know you' activities. They thought about how they were connected as a class through likes and interests. They created a spider's web of connections and were told about the connections in the brain and how the harder they work, the more they persevere, the stronger the connections will be in their brains.

The children were introduced to their new topic 'Chocolate' by becoming chocolate scientists! They used the different senses to see how much they knew about chocolate. For example, they were blindfold and had to see if they could distinguish the difference between dark, milk and white chocolate through taste and smell. They also had to describe the difference between the taste of chocolate and other sweet treats such as dried fruit. They had great fun!

Jewish Studies

This week in Jewish Studies we have implemented our new Hebrew reading scheme which the children are very excited about. We have also been learning the sounds of the Shofar in preparation for Rosh Hashanah.

<u>lvrit</u>

A touch of Hebrew is an app you can download for free on any iPad- here you will find the topics that your children are learning about in Ivrit. The children can watch the videos and play the Ivrit games that they enjoy in class.

Year 3 has now moved onto a new programme of study called Ivrit Be'Click. The children will learn Ivrit vocabulary based on topics. The first topic is אָיָאָ (Mi ani – who am I?). The class will concentrate on this topic for this term. The key words include: אָני (Mi – who), אָני (Ani – I am), אַנָּה (Ata – you are), אַת (At – you are), בּוֹקֶר טוֹב (Boker tov – good morning), לַיְלָה טוֹב (Lila tov – good night), אַת (Shalom – hello), לְהָתְרָאוֹת (Lehitraot – good bye), מִי אַתָה (Mi ata? – who are you?), יָשָׁר (Mi at? – who are you?), יָשָׁיָד קוֹרָאִים לְך (Eich korim lecha? – what is your name? masculine), יָשַּיך קוֹרָאִים לַך (Eich korim lach? – what is your name? feminine), יְשָׁי קּלוֹמֶך (Eich korim lach? – what is your name? feminine), יֶשָּיד קוֹרָאִים לַך (Ma shlomcha? – how are you?) מָד מַד לַיָר (Ma shlomech? – how are you? Masculine), מָד מַד נָק (Metzuyan – excellent), מָצוּיָן (Ma nishma? – how are you?), מָד גַשָּפָשָר גַם (Efshar gam? – may I also have?).

The class is learning the song אָלוֹהָים שֶׁלִי (Elohim sheli – my God) which you can find here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=534t0Ny5iIA
