This week has flown by!

English – We have continued to read 'The Journey' by Francesca Sanna and have started to plan and write our persuasive letters. We have looked at the features of persuasive writing and have put the features into our own pieces.

Maths – The children have been working hard on place value concepts. They have been strengthening their reasoning around 5 digit and 6 digit numbers.

Topic – The children have enjoyed making weather reports about natural disasters. We participated in science experiments about bird beaks and how they are adapted to the type of food they eat.
