Dear Parents,

This week we launched the new topic, "Fairgrounds".

English —We continued reading our class book "Floodland". We focused on chapter 3 where William told Zoe a story similar to the greek myth about Daedalus and Icarus. So this week we worked on the skills of summarising a text and drawing comparisons between stories and thought about why William told Zoe this story. We used Point, Evidence, Explain to answer questions about the text. We also looked at the poem "Dr Foster went to Gloucester" which William talked about, and wrote our own stories based on the poem. Our spelling focus for the week was the language of possiblility eg *frequently, immediately, definitely* and *possibly*.

Maths – This week we have been looking at fractions and their decimal equivalents and have been calculating percentages of amounts. We solved problems about percentages.

Topic – This week we have learnt about the art of Fred Fowle a fairground artist who uses striking 3D lettering to create images on Fairground rides. We will be using this style to create our own art work for Purim next week. We have also been exploring and comparing maps of theme parks. In science we have started to think about how the sense of sight effects our experiences of a fairground. We researched how we see and drew labelled diagrams of the eye.

JS – In Jewish Studies we learnt about the last bracha of the Amidah and we then wrote the Amidah as a recipe, thinking about the ingredients as well as the methods that goes into 'mixing' it. It was lovely to see some very creative work from everyone. We also started to prepare for Purim and children were given a focus pasuk of each chapter about which they started writing a playscript. Once all the scripts are completed, we plan to act out our Purim story as a class.
