Dear Parents,

Welcome back! It has been a lovely week back in school with the children. They have settled into Year 2 well, adapting to the new classroom environment and the Bubble rules.



English

The class began the term by looking at the front cover of our class book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. They discussed their thoughts on the planet that we live on and wrote down questions they wanted to find out. They used Google Earth to look at the

whole planet spinning in space, before zooming in to our school and writing how they felt about being back.

Continuous Provision

The children have continued working on the following activities to enhance their learning this week: Phonics: reading sounds and spotting them in both real and nonsense words Funky Fingers: putting 'pollen' in the 'honeycomb' and making their own Maths: addition and subtraction calculation solving Creative: making a person and handprint to represent themselves Writing: writing about their summer holiday Loose Parts: creating a Rosh Hashanah picture Jewish Studies: designing a Rosh Hashanah card



Maths

This week, the children revised tens and ones in various numbers. They used dienes, number lines, hundred squares and number fans to represent these numbers in a variety of ways, before putting their knowledge to the test by filling in missing number lines, writing numbers in order from smallest to biggest and biggest to smallest, as well as writing clear 'stem' sentences, such as 72 has 7 tens and 2 ones.

<u>Art – Take One Picture</u>

The class greatly enjoyed taking a close look at our Take One Picture project painting 'The Battle of San Romano' by Paolo Uccello. They spotted a variety of items in the painting and had many questions about different aspects of the work. Some children wondered what the people were holding. Others questioned why there were broken sticks on the floor. Children even asked if the subject of the painting was real. They are looking forward to learning more in the coming weeks.



Jewish Studies

This week in Year 2 we have been learning all about the upcoming chag of Rosh Hashanah. The children know the customs associated with the Chag and have begun working on their plan for their Shana Tova cards.

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This week Year 2 had a recap of some of last year's greetings phrases such: שַבוּעַ טוֹב 'Shavua Tov' (Have a lovely week), יום טוב 'Shalom' (Hello/ goodbye/ peace), בוֹקָר טוֹב 'Boker Tov' (Good morning), יום טוב - 'Yom Tov' (Good day), י אַבֵּת יָשָלום (Have a peaceful Shabbat/Saturday), אַחַר צָהָרַיִם טוּבִים אַחר אָהַר אַהַריַ טובים - Achar tzahoraim tovim (Good - ברובים הַבַּאים - Lehitra'ot (Goodbye/see you soon). They also learnt a new phrase: - בָרוּבִים הַבַּאים Welcome (Bruchim habaim).

The class has gone over some greetings songs: 'Shavua Tov', 'Shalom shalom' 'Boker Tov' and 'Shabbat Shalom'.

Next Week

In English, the children will be creating a guide to Earth for visitors.

In Maths, the class will be continuing their work on place value.

In Topic, the children will be identifying different countries around the World.

In JS, Year 2 will be learning about the Shofar and the names of the sounds.
