Dear Parents,

Year 4 have had a great start to the year. The children have shared their exciting summer holidays and demonstrated the skills they have learnt when at home. We have launched our topic, "Achdut", Togetherness.

Maths

In Maths, the children revised place value. They looked at the value of each digit in a four digit number and represented this using resources and pictures. The children also recapped multiples of 100, what a multiple means and found the previous and next multiple of 100 in three digit numbers. Finally, the children ordered and compared numbers by finding 1, 10 and 100 more or less of a number.

English

In English, the children started the book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. They began by making a prediction about what they thought the book was about and also how the front cover made them feel. They looked at the first two pages of the book and looked at the vastness of space and the Earth. They thought about their favourite space on Earth and why it is their favourite place. They then thought about their favourite person and memory in that place. The children will be writing letters about this next week.

Other areas of the curriculum

The children were introduced to the 'Back to School' Heads Up programme. They thought of the solar system as representing different feelings and emotions around lockdown, coming back to school and day-to-day life. They wrote about their own feelings on their own feelings solar system. The children also took part in a simple experiment. They looked at the different elements of writing up an experiment and wrote up the aim, prediction, method, results and conclusion of the simple experiment done in class.

Ivrit

This week Year 4 had a recap of the vocabulary of the topic יוֹם הּוּלֶדֶת (Yom Huledet – birthday). The words they had gone over were: מַתְנַה (Nerot – candles), עוּגָה (Uga- cake), עוּגוֹת (Ugot – cakes), מַתְנַה (Ugot – cakes), מַתְנַוֹת (Ugot – cakes), לָה (La – to her), לֹ (Lo – to him), זֶר (Lo – to him), לֹ (Lo – to him), סוּפַרְיוֹת (Sukariot – sweets), בַּלוֹת (Balon – balloon), סוּפַרְיוֹת (Bat – girl), בַּלְהַ אַתָּה? (Bat – girl), בַּתְ בַּמָה אַתָּה? (Bat – how old are you? - Masculine), בַּת בַּמָה אַתַּ? (Bat kama at? – how old are you? - Feminine).

Finally, please keep practising times tables with your child. Once they have mastered the 3,4 and 8 times tables, you can start to practise the 6,7 and 9. TT Rockstars is also a great resource to help support children.
