Dear Parents,

We have had another great week in Year 3! Everyone enjoyed Friendship Week and did kind things for their secret friends. For Road Safety week, the children were reminded of how to safely cross the road using zebra crossing and other safe road crossings

Maths

In Maths, we compared and ordered numbers up to 1,000. The children weighed and ordered some objects from the lightest to the heaviest. They also weighed objects on scales and matched different objects to the right weight. The children started to understand the difference between grams and kilograms.

We also revised the times tables the children have learnt so far with a focus on the 3 and 4 times tables. The children continued to practise column addition and subtraction as part of their continuous provision activities.

English

In English, we discussed the facts that the children found out at home about Alexander Graham Bell. The children started to understand how phones have developed over the time.

We also started to look at the features of letters. The children looked at different letters and found out about where the date goes, what language to use and how to lay out their work.

Then, the pupils started to think of an invention to solve a problem at school. They drew their invention and labelled it. Next week, they will write instructions for their invention accompanied by a letter to Mrs Baron to present their work to her.

The children learnt how to punctuate direct speech correctly. They continued practising the spellings from the Year 3 and 4 list with commonly misspelt words. We focused on the 'ur' sound this week which is spelt using 'ear'. The children's spellings of the week are early, learn, earth, heard and search.

Science

In Science, after having discovered a few facts about Isaac Newton, the children carried out a fair test about gravity. Our investigation involved dropping a variety of objects at the same height. Our task was to record how fast these objects fall to the ground.

Jewish Studies

This week in Jewish Studies, the children have been learning their parts for the Chagigah and have been practising their songs. They also learnt in this week's Parasha that two twin boys were born to Yitzchak and Rivka, called Yaakov and Eisav, who had very different character traits.

<u>Ivrit</u>

Year 3 started the topic הַמִּשְׁפָּהָה שָׁלִי - My family. The class will continue learning this topic throughout this half term. The words for this topic include: מָּבָּא (Mishpacha – family), מָּבָּא (Saba – grandfather), אָה גָדוֹלָה (Savta – grandmother), אָה גָדוֹלָה (Aba – dad), אָה גָדוֹלָה (Ach gadol – big brother), אָה קְטַנָה (Ach katan – little brother), אָהוֹת גְדוֹלָה (Achot gdola – big sister), אָה קָטַנָה (Mi ze? – who is it? Feminine), אֵין (Mi zot? – who is it? Feminine), אֵין

לי (Ein li – I don't have), יֵשׁ לִי (Yesh li – I do have), דוֹדָ (Dod – uncle), בֶּן דוֹד (Doda – aunt), בֶּן דוֹד (Ben dod – cousin, masculine), בַּת דוֹדָה (Bat doda – cousin, feminine).
