## Dear Parents,

This has been an exciting week getting ready for Chanukah and starting the celebrations on Thursday!

# <u>Maths</u>

In Maths this week we have concluded our work on addition. The children have learnt how to add two 2-digits numbers when crossing over ten. This has been a new concept for all children and has been a bit of a challenge. However, the children have done a tremendous job! We looked at this through using a 100 square and also through adding the tens and ones separately abstractly. The children have also been reviewing adding two 2-digit numbers and showing their workings clearly.

## <u>English</u>

In English this week the children have been redrafting their writing. They have been focusing on applying their joins and including their corrections. These will be going on display, and when completed a version will be uploaded to Seesaw for you to see! We have also been looking at the Zones of Regulation and the terminology we can use to describe feelings in the different zones.

## Other areas of the curriculum

In History this week, the children have been looking at old toys. We explored different Jack-in-the-Boxes from different periods of time. The children explored these and discussed the materials they were made of. They then worked very hard on their fine motor skills to make pop up Jack-in-the Boxes. In Art and DT the children have been looking at a range of materials and have been using these to create a material collage of Traction Man. The children created our Chanukah door based on this theme and created paper aeroplanes and posters for our door.

#### Jewish Studies

This week we have learnt what a kosher Chanukiah looks like and how we light it. We now know all the letters on the sevivon and what they symbolise. We are progressing well with our Aleph Champ activities and are becoming more fluent. The school have enjoyed celebrating Chanukah with candle lighting each day, eating doughnuts on Thursday kindly provided by the PSA and hearing Rabbi Shochet deliver his Chanukah message to the school.

### <u>lvrit</u>

This week Year 2 learnt about Chanukah. We have practiced our sentences using these words: (Leviva- latke), (Leviva- latke), אוֹכָל, (Levivot- latkes), אוֹכָל, (Sufgania – doughnut), סוּפְגָנִיוֹת (Sufganiot – doughnuts), סוּפְגָנִיוֹת (Ochel – eating, male), אוֹכָל, (Ochel – eating, female), אוֹכַל, (Ohev – love, masculine), רוֹאָה (Ohevet – love, feminine), רוֹאָה (Roa – see, feminine), רוֹאָה (Roa – see, feminine).
