Dear Parents,

This week the children have been working very hard and their main focus has been on upleveling their work and spotting their own mistakes.

#### Maths

This week in Maths we have been linking our learning to the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe Number Day. The class have been exploring numbers in different ways. We have used this opportunity to review work on counting in 2,5,3 and 10 and the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. The class have also reviewed in more detail the terms clockwise and anti-clockwise to ensure they are confident about the meaning of these terms before moving forward.

#### **English**

In English this week the children have continued working on our new class book: The Secret Sky Garden. The children have continued to uplevel their poems in their neatest handwriting. This has been done one-on-one to help perfect joins and ensure every child meets their potential. We have also been introduced to a new character 'Zoo'. The class made excellent comparisons between the two characters and have worked hard on writing predictions about their future interactions. The class have also been focusing on their spellings in Support for Spelling and have been using the Complex Speed Sound Chart for guidance.

## Other areas of the curriculum

This week the class have been writing descriptions of their habitat to accompany their excellent work from last year. The class have been ensuring this is in their neatest handwriting to ensure that they have done the best they can. This week our main focus has been the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe. The class have reviewed who trusted adults are and the importance of understanding happy places.

## **Jewish Studies**

This week in Jewish Studies, we have continued learning to read and write our script letters. In Parashah we discussed that we have a special rest day every seven days called Shabbat. The land in Eretz Yisrael has a special rest year every seven years.

The mitzvah of Shmittah helps us to remember that although the farmer works hard on his land, it is Hashem who makes things grow.
